The Grace brand quilting frame is about 20 years old and has been used only once for quilting a queen sized quilt. It takes up more space that I'm willing to give up.

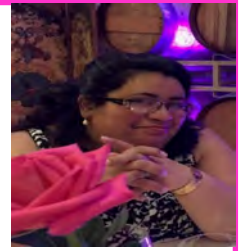

INTERVIEW WITH GUILD MEMBER MICHELLE KELLEY

SGQG: Where were you born?

MK: I was born in Alameda.

SGQG: Are you married, have children.?

MK: Yes I have one daughter and one son and three grandkids. Mike and I just celebrated 35 years of marriage.

SGQG: Are you retired and if so, from what?

MK: I have been an Antique and Collectible dealer for over 25 years, we had a family owned business that was the largest privately owned Antiques Store in the Greater Bay Area named Paulines Antiques in Alameda. We have been actively liquidating our business since 2015, we no longer hold estate sales or sell at Antique shows, but at one time we attended over 20 Antique shows a year along the Northern California Antique Show Circuit from Old Folsom going down to Moss Landing. We are now down to two facilities that we are liquidating. We sell online, and have been selling on eBay since 6 months after they opened, and that has been a interesting ride. I remember when they didn't accept pictures on the platform, and then when we had to scan our photos in after we had them developed to upload them on dial-up!

SGQG: When did you move to this area?

MK: We moved here permanently in 2017 but bought our property in 2010. We liked the area because we've come here quite often when we stayed at my in-laws cabin in Mt. Ranch and each of us as kids.

SGQG: I understand you're one of the committee members for the 501-C?

MK: Yes. I felt it was important to volunteer for this committee due to the complexity of the issues involved and to ensure it was completed properly. I have experience dealing with difficult issues and felt comfortable volunteering. I also felt this issue was much to complex for one person to take on, and that it should be a joint effort. The process should take 1-2 years and we've already talked with an attorney and he is also looking for an accountant who is familiar with unpaid and delinquent taxes. Patty Carr created a special committee named the 501c-Committee. It's a three member committee: Paula Bibby-Non-Profit Paperwork, Debby Sweeten-Taxes and Fees, Michelle Kelley-Chair, along with Patty Carr. Members voted and passed a budget for Legal and Professional fees of \$2500.00. We are not qualified to hold a Raffle. We will not be offering the Opportunity Quilt for 2023. Please watch the Power Point Presentation from the California AG office on the overview of 501c Non-Profits. (link below) Not all of the information on the presentation applies to us, but there are some very important parts of the presentation that does apply to us as a group. MK: I love the feel of the fabric going through the machine. It's a comfort and calmness that comes with confidence. I dislike "sandwiching" a quilt. I understand how important it is but would gladly pay someone to do it for me. I also love starting projects.

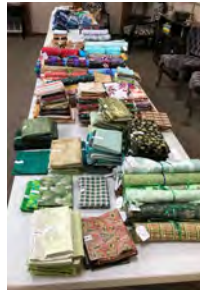
SGQG: Who inspires you most in quilting?

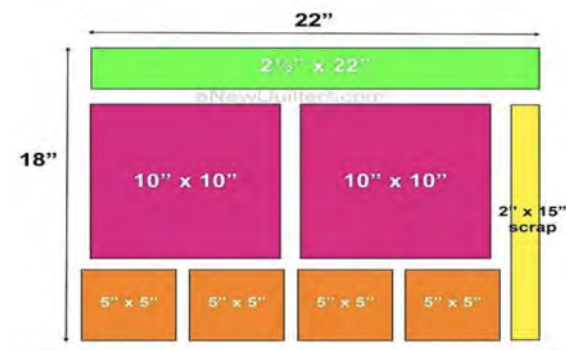

RED SHOES IN TWOS

New Shoes but whose?

Use two shoes, or more from the fabric I gave you. The two shoes do not have to be next to each other. They can be in different places on the quilt. The shoes can be as they appear on the fabric or you can cut them apart. You can use as many shoes as you want. There must be at least two recognized as shoes. The shoes must be complete, not just the heel or toe. The shoes must be on the front of the quilt.

Quilt Size

Can be anything from small quilt, (100 inches around) to Lap quilt, (45 x 45) or (180 inches around) with no side larger than 72 inches. They are due on the day the quilts for the show are due. And the same rules for finishing them apply. Label with your name, sleeves for hanging, if bigger than small quilt. The quilts will be judged for favorite, most unusual and funniest. With \$30.00 for each category.

The fee for entries in the Quilts Division is \$5. Maximum 2/class

2. Premium cash prizes are awarded to the Best of Division, for each division.

Division 197-Novice Quilter (having quilted 1 year or less) has a \$50 Premium for Best of Division

3. Quilt Sizes: Small-no larger than 216”; Medium-217”-299”; Large-300”+
