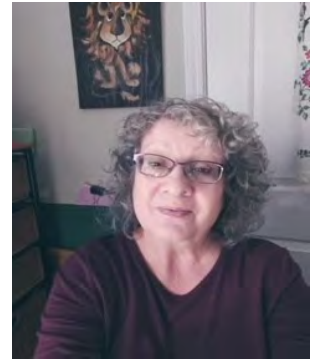

INTERVIEW WITH GUILD MEMBER

ULLA DOTY



SGQG: Where were you born?

UD: Hofheim, Germany. I moved to the US in 1987

SGQG: Do you have children?

UD: Yes, I have one daughter, two sons and 6 grandchildren.

SGQG: What did you do before retiring?

UD: I was a school teacher for 1st and 2nd grade students. I retired in 2019 but have been quilting for 20 years.

SGQG: What's your favorite part of quilting?

UD: I enjoy sharing my quilts with family and friends. I am also drawn to the 1800's fabrics and like picking out the fabrics and pattern. My first impression of quilts was on American TV shows like Bonanza. I made my first quilt in 1978 with my sister. We made a quilt for my first child. When we were putting it together, we knew something should be in the middle but didn't know what. My Mom ended up finding something in Germany that resembled batting and we used that. Then I picked up quilting again in 2002.

SGQG: What's the least favorite part of quilting?

UD: I do not like the mundane rhythm of stitching and sewing the binding onto the back of the quilt.

SGQG: Do you have a sewing background?

UD: I made a couple of outfits for myself when I was in my 20's but that's it.

SGQG: Do you have other hobbies?

UD: Yes, I also knit, crochet and do embroidery. I still have a crochet bedspread that my husband's great grandma made. I also enjoy gardening.

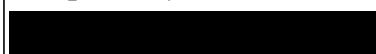

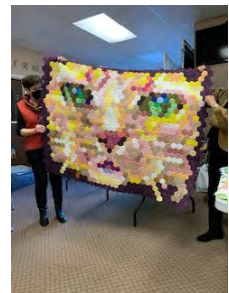
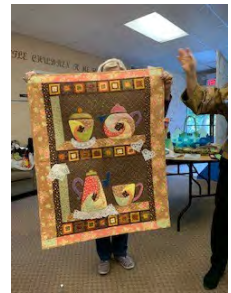
