As I write this we are still deep in preparation for the quilt show! I personally want to thank all of you who contributed to this effort! All your help no matter how small was greatly appreciated!

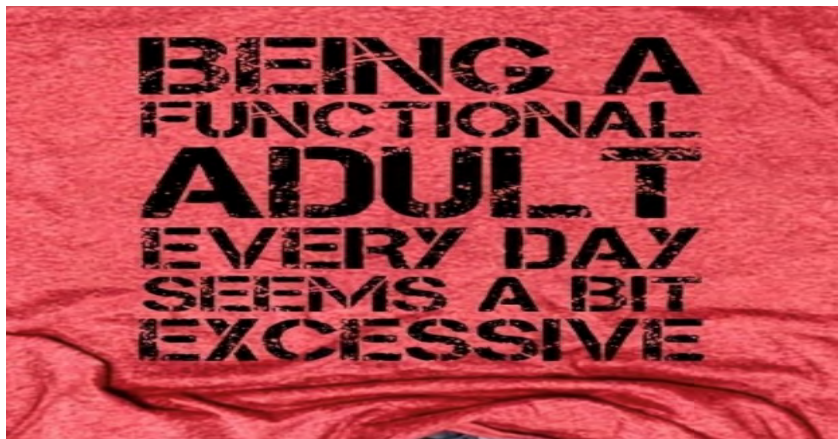
I’m so pleased that our newer members have jumped in with both feet and volunteered, and are excited to be a part of this!

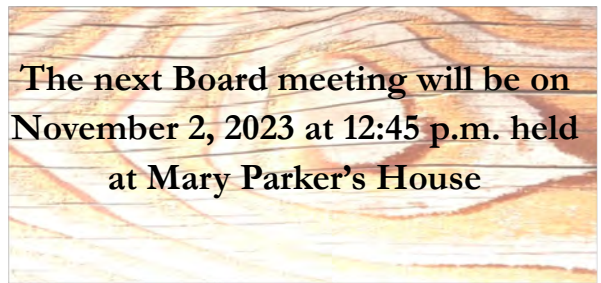

INTERVIEW WITH GUILD MEMBER PAULA BIBBY

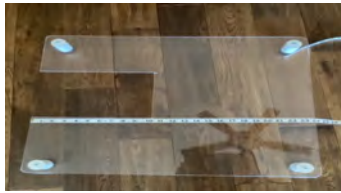
MEMBER BULLETIN BOARD

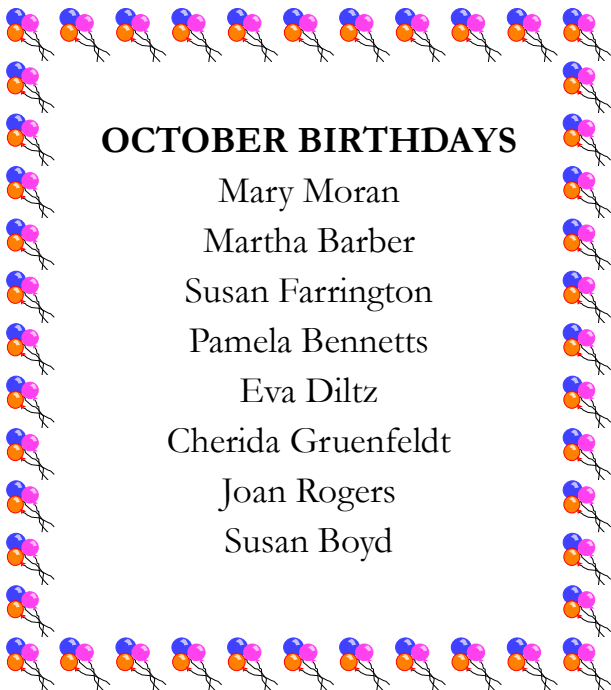

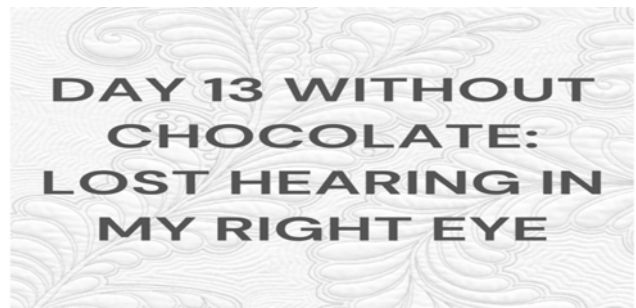

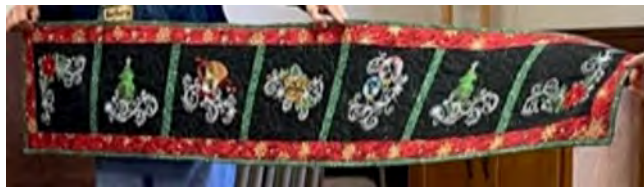
Quilt Show Windows
